Students served through Special Education who are also identified as Gifted and Talented, Military-Connected, Experiencing Homelessness, or who are in Foster Care.

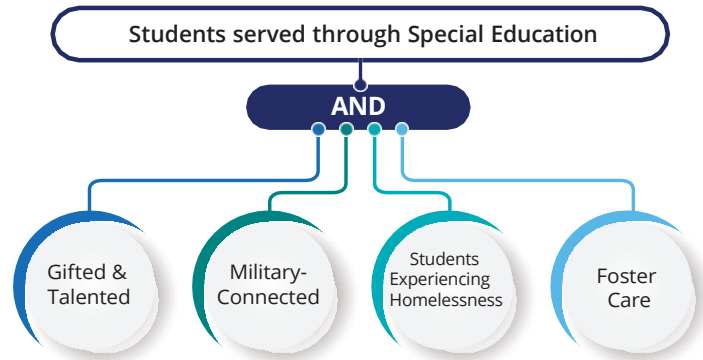


Do you know how to find resources to help support dual-identified students with multiple exceptionalities, or with multiple needs?

The TEA developed **online courses to support dual-identified students with multiple exceptionalities**. These courses provide awareness and guidance to educators working with students who are served by special education and are also identified as **gifted and talented, military-connected, experiencing homelessness, or who are in foster care**.

Who is a dual-identified student?

A dual-identified student is served by special education in one or more specific disability categories, as defined in the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act, and has at least one additional identifier such as gifted and talented, emergent bilingual*, or highly-mobile.



Dual-Identified Asynchronous Courses:

There are **3 asynchronous courses available**, these focus on:

- (1) Students Served by Special Education and Identified as Gifted and Talented
- (2) Students Served by Special Education Who are Military-Connected
- (3) Students Served by Special Education Who are Experiencing Homelessness or in Foster Care
